### Used Computers and Computer Equipment

The City of Brillion does not have the capabilities of collecting used computers and equipment. Computers and their peripherals contain a number of hazardous wastes that are harmful to the environment, including lead, cadmium, and mercury. Wisconsin hazardous waste regulations (ch. NR 610 and 615) prohibit businesses and institutions from disposing of computers in landfills. No similar regulations apply to Wisconsin residents, but for those who are concerned about the integrity of Wisconsin's environment do have a few options to consider:

- Check with schools or nonprofit organizations to see if the computer is worthy of reuse. Donations are tax deductible.
- Deliver your used computer/parts to the Brown County Household Hazardous Waste facility at 2561 S. Broadway, Green Bay. Get more details by calling the Calumet County UWEX office at 920-849-1450 or 989-2700
- Deliver your used computer to one of the Department of Corrections used computer drop-off sites. Sites closest to Calumet County are located in Oshkosh, Fond du Lac, and Plymouth.

# City Recycling Services

**The City Contracts Onyx Waste Services** for all garbage and recycling pickup needs. You can contact them toll free at 1-800-279-1930.

Recyclable materials will be picked up bi-weekly, alternate sides of the City. If you need your trash can replaced or have questions regarding this Garbage and Recycling Collection Schedule, please contact the Brillion City Hall at 756-2250.

If you have yard waste, please discard at the City compost site, conveniently located off USH 10!

## Recycling Guidelines

### Aluminum, Plastic, Glass, Tin, Steel:

May be co-mingled in transparent blue, white or clear bags. No black yard bags. All items are to be clean, rinsed out thoroughly, tops and caps removed.

- Aluminum - rinse out
- Tin containers - remove labels & rinse
- Steel containers - no scrap steel
- Plastics - #1 & #2 (soap & soda bottles, milk jugs)
- Glass containers: clear, brown, green colors. Keep all bottles and jars whole
- Glass items such as cocktail glasses, plate glass, and ceramics are not recyclable.

NOTE: Plastic bags accepted to store shredded paper ONLY.

### Batteries:

Must be undamaged and intact, and will be accepted at curbside during normal recycling pickup days.

### Cardboard and Paper:

Magazines, newspapers, and chipboard (cereal and cake boxes) may be co-mingled in:

- Brown paper grocery bags
- Corrugated cardboard boxes
- Cereal, cake, and detergent boxes
- Soda or beer 12pack/24pack cartons.

Guidelines for corrugated cardboard boxes:

- Must be flattened and bound.
- Large quantities should be cut into 2' X 2' sections, then flattened and bound.

### Waste Oil:

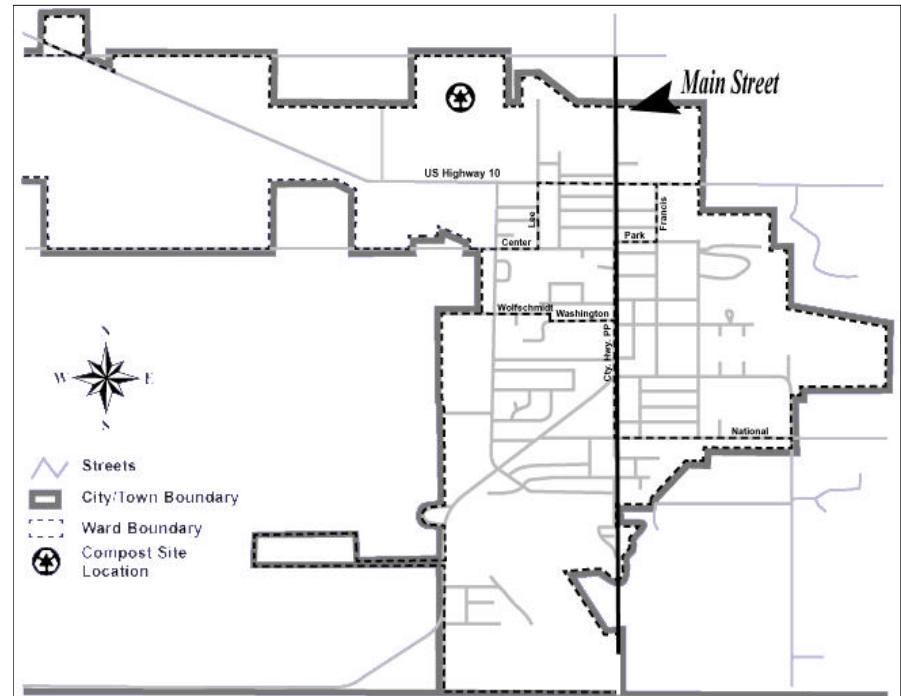
Will be cautiously accepted at curbside if placed in a leak proof covered milk jug. Oil cannot be mixed with any other fluid. Onyx Waste Services recommends that residents utilize local garages and their services to change automobile oil for proper disposal of these fluids.

### Large Items/Heavy Refuse:

Pick up is scheduled for Wednesdays. Make arrangements with City Hall one week prior to pickup.

- Fee is \$5 per item.
- Those with Freon removed are \$20.00\*
- Tires (standard automobile/car) \$2.00 per tire
- Tires (tractors) \$8.00 per tire.

\* Items containing Freon cannot be collected
