### ARTICLE II. DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT\*

#### **Sec. 30-31. Appointment.**

The emergency government and services director shall be appointed by the mayor, subject to confirmation by the council, and shall receive such salary as shall be determined by the council. He shall take and file an official oath.

#### **Sec. 30-32. Deputy and assistant directors.**

Deputy and assistant directors may be appointed by the emergency government management and services director, subject to confirmation by the council.

#### **Sec. 30-33. Duties and authority of director.**

- (a) The emergency government and services director shall be the executive head of the emergency government and service organization and shall be responsible for the organization, administration and operation of such, subject to the direction and control of the mayor and the council. He shall coordinate all activities for civil emergencies within the city and maintain liaison and cooperate with agencies and organizations of

other political subdivisions and of the state and federal governments, and participate in county and state activities upon request and have such additional authority, duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the council.

- (b) He shall prepare a comprehensive general plan for civil emergencies and government of the city and present such plan to the council for approval, and all departments of the city shall have the duties and functions assigned to them in the plan. The plan may be modified from time to time in like manner. This plan shall provide for the use of public and private property as shelters or other public use when emergencies are proclaimed; and in carrying out this section, the director may enter into and upon private property during reasonable times for inspection purposes.
- (c) He shall perform such other functions as are prescribed in Wis. Stats. § 66.325.

**Sec. 30-34. Utilization of existing services and facilities.**

In preparing and executing the civil defense plan, the director shall utilize the services, equipment, supplies and facilities of the existing departments, employees and agencies of the city to the maximum extent practicable; and the officers and personnel of all such departments and agencies shall cooperate with and extend such services and facilities to the director.
