## **ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL**

### **Sec. 94-1. State forfeiture laws.**

All provisions of Wis. Stats. chs. 340--349 describing and defining regulations with respect to vehicles and traffic of which the penalty is a forfeiture only, including the penalties that constitute forfeitures are imposed are adopted by reference as part of this section as if

fully set forth. Any act that is a violation of statute shall be incorporated by reference if required or prohibited by this section.

**Sec. 94-2. Penalty for violation of chapter.**

The penalty for violation of any provision of this chapter shall be a forfeiture, together with the costs of prosecution as provided in Wis. Stats. §§ 345.20--345.53.

**Sec. 94-3. Uniform offenses.**

Forfeitures for violation of any provision of Wis. Stats. chs. 340--349 shall conform to forfeitures for violation of the comparable state offense, including any variations or increases for second offenses and Wisconsin Administrative Code per Act 190 (5-12-1998).

The statutory provisions describing and defining regulations with respect to vehicles and traffic in the following enumerated sections of the statutes, exclusive of any provisions relating to the penalties to be imposed or the punishment for violation of such statutes, are adopted and by reference made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated by reference is required or prohibited by this chapter.

#### **Sec. 94-5. Ratification of traffic control devices.**

All traffic control signs, signals, devices and markings in place on the date of adoption of this Code are expressly ratified and confirmed by the council.

#### **Sec. 94-6. Public property operating restrictions.**

No person shall operate any motor vehicle, including motorcycles, minibikes and mopeds, on any property of the city, except upon clearly marked public roadways.

### **ARTICLE II. ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT\***

#### **Sec. 94-36. Traffic procedures.**

- (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), the apprehension of alleged violators of traffic regulations and the trial of forfeiture actions for the violation of traffic regulations shall be governed by Wis. Stats. §§ 23.33, 66.12, 345.21--345.53, 350.17, ch. 800.
- (b) Provisions relating to the uniform traffic citation in Wis. Stats. §§ 345.11, to arrests in 345.21--345.24, to deposits and pleas of no contest under 345.26, to the authority of

the court under 345.37, 345.47, 345.48 and 345.50 and to guaranteed arrest bonds under 345.61 apply.

- (c) Wis. Stats. § 967.055 applies to traffic forfeiture actions for violations of Wis. Stats. § 346.63(1) or (5) adopted in section 94-1.

### **Sec. 94-37. Uniform citation.**

The uniform traffic citation promulgated under Wis. Stats. § 345.11 shall be used for all moving traffic violations under this chapter.

### **Sec. 94-38. Parking and nonmoving citations.**

- (a) Citations for all nonmoving traffic violations under this chapter shall conform to Wis. Stats. § 345.28 and shall permit direct mail payment of the applicable minimum forfeiture to the police department within five days of the issuance of the citation in lieu of court appearance. The issuing officer shall specify on the citation the amount of the applicable forfeiture as follows:

- (1) Parking in handicapped parking zone . . . \$20.00
- (2) Parking too close to fire hydrant . . . 20.00
- (3) Parking in area designated as school zone . . . 15.00
- (4) Parking overnight on street during winter parking ban . . . 10.00
- (5) Parking in manner that obstructs traffic . . . 10.00
- (6) Parking on wrong side of street facing traffic . . . 10.00
- (7) Parking within or on crosswalk . . . 10.00
- (8) Double parking . . . 10.00
- (9) Parking across or blocking sidewalk . . . 10.00
- (10) Overtime parking in limited zones . . . 5.00
- (11) Parking in no parking zones . . . 5.00
- (12) Parking to obstruct driveway or alleyway . . . 5.00
- (13) Any other parking violation . . . 5.00

An additional \$10.00 will be assessed for nonpayment within ten days after the date of violation. Thirty dollars after 20 days, \$45.00 after 30 days, and an order of license suspension after 45 days.

- (b) Any vehicle remaining stationary at one location for three consecutive days, and after three consecutive parking tickets have been issued shall be towed at the owner's expense. It shall be deemed abandoned and the owner of the vehicle will be

responsible for the costs of towing, storage, and outstanding parking violations, prior to the release of the vehicle.

### **Sec. 94-39. Information to persons charged.**

- (a) Whenever a person is charged with a violation of a traffic regulation, the police officer shall inform the person of the following:
  - (1) That certain convictions may result in revocation or suspension of his operating privilege if the conviction will have that effect.
  - (2) That demerit points may be assessed against his driving record for the offense. The police officer may estimate the number of demerit points for the particular offense and list it on the traffic citation form.
  - (3) The number of demerit points that is cause for revocation or suspension.
- (b) Before taking the plea of a person charged with a violation of law, the judge shall inform the violator of the following:
  - (1) That conviction of the charge may result in the revocation or suspension of his operating privilege.
  - (2) The number of demerit points that may be assessed against the violator upon conviction of the violation, based on the available information.
- (c) Whenever a person has been convicted on the basis of a forfeiture of deposit or a plea of guilty or no contest and the person was not informed as required under subsections (a) and (b), the person may, within 60 days after being notified of the revocation or suspension of the operating privilege, petition the court to reopen the judgment and grant him an opportunity to defend on the merits. If the court finds that the petitioner was not informed as required under subsections (a) and (b), the court shall order the judgment reopened. The court order reopening the judgment automatically reinstates the revoked or suspended operating privilege.

### **Sec. 94-40. Deposit.**

- (a) *Authorized.*
  - (1) A person arrested under Wis. Stats. § 345.22 or 345.28(5) for the violation of a traffic regulation who is allowed to make a deposit by statute shall deposit the money as the arresting officer directs by either mailing the deposit at a nearby mailbox to the office of the clerk of court, or by going, in the custody of the arresting officer, to such place to make the deposit.
  - (2) The arresting officer or the person receiving the deposit shall notify the arrested person, orally or in writing, that if the person makes a deposit for a violation of a traffic regulation, the person need not appear in court at the time fixed in the

citation, and the person will be deemed to have tendered a plea of no contest and submitted to a forfeiture and a penalty assessment, if required by Wis. Stats. § 165.87, and a jail assessment, if required by Wis. Stats. § 302.46(1), plus any applicable fees prescribed in Wis. Stats. ch. 814, not to exceed the amount of the deposit that the court may accept as provided in Wis. Stats. § 345.37.

(b) *Amount.*

- (1) The basic amount of the deposit for the alleged violation of a traffic regulation shall be determined in accordance with the deposit schedule established by the judicial conference.
- (2) In addition to the amount in subsection (b)(1), the deposit shall include court costs, including any applicable fees prescribed in Wis. Stats. ch. 814, any applicable penalty assessment, and any applicable jail assessment.
- (3) If a deposit schedule has not been established, the arresting officer shall require the alleged offender to deposit not less than the maximum forfeiture permitted under this chapter.

**Sec. 94-41. Official traffic signs and signals.**

- (a) *Public works director authorized to procure and erect signs and signals.* The public works director shall procure, erect and maintain appropriate standard traffic signs, signals and markings conforming to the rules of the state highway division, giving such notice of the provisions of this chapter as required by state law. Signs shall be erected in such locations and manner as the public works director shall determine will best effect the purposes of this chapter and give adequate warning to users of the streets or highways.
- (b) *Removal of unofficial signs and signals.* The public works director shall have the authority granted by Wis. Stats. § 349.09 and may order the removal of a sign, signal, marking or device placed, maintained or displayed in violation of this chapter or Wis. Stats. § 346.41. Any charge imposed on premises for removal of such an illegal sign, signal or device shall be reported to the council at its next regular meeting for review and certification.

**Sec. 94-42. Accident reports.**

- (a) *Immediate notice of accident.* The operator of a vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injury to or death of any person, any damage to state or other government-owned property, except a state or other government-owned vehicle, to an apparent extent of \$200.00 or more or total damage to property owned by any one person or to a state or other government-owned vehicle to an apparent extent of

\$1,000.00 or more shall immediately by the quickest means of communication give notice of such accident to the police department, the sheriff's department or the traffic department of the county or municipality in which the accident occurred or to a state traffic patrol officer. In this subsection, "injury" means injury to a person of a physical nature resulting in death or the need of first aid or attention by a physician or surgeon, whether or not first aid or medical or survival treatment was actually received; "total damage to property owned by one person" means the sum total cost of putting the property damaged in the condition it was before the accident, if repair thereof is practical, and if not practical, the sum total cost of replacing such property. For purposes of this subsection if any property which is damaged is held in a form of joint or multiple ownership, the property shall be considered to be owned by one person.

- (b) *Written report of accident.* Unless a report is made under subsection (e) of this section by a law enforcement agency, within ten days after an accident of the type described in subsection (a) of this section, the operator of a vehicle involved in the accident shall forward a written report of the accident to the department. The department may accept or require a report of the accident to be filed by an occupant or the owner in lieu of a report from the operator. Every accident report required to be made in writing shall be made on the appropriate form approved by the department and shall contain all of the information required therein unless not available. The report shall include information sufficient to enable the department to determine whether the requirements for deposit of security under Wis. Stats. § 344.14 are inapplicable by reason of the existence of insurance or other exceptions specified in Wis. Stats. ch. 344.
- (c) *Who to report when operator unable.* Whenever the operator of a vehicle is physically incapable of giving the notice and making the report required by subsections (a) and (b) of this section, the owner of the vehicle involved in the accident shall give the notice and make the report required by subsections (a) and (b) of this section. If the owner of the vehicle is physically or mentally incapable of giving the notice and making the report required by subsections (a) and (b) of this section, and if there was another occupant in the vehicle at the time of the accident capable of giving the notice and making the report, the occupant shall give the notice and make the report.
- (d) *Duty of department with respect to accident reports.* The department may require any operator, occupant or owner of a vehicle involved in an accident of which report must be made as provided in section 94-42(a) to file supplemental reports whenever the original report is insufficient in the opinion of the department and may require witnesses of accidents to render reports to the department. The department shall tabulate and may analyze all accident reports and shall publish annually or at more frequent intervals statistical information based thereon as to the number and circumstances of traffic accidents. The department shall prepare and supply at its own expense to police departments, coroners, sheriffs and other suitable agencies or individuals, forms or an automated format for accident reports required to be made to the department. Any report forms and automated format shall call for sufficiently detailed information to disclose with reference to a traffic accident the cause, conditions then existing, and the persons and vehicles involved.
- (e) *Police and traffic agencies to report.* Every law enforcement agency investigating or receiving a report of a traffic accident as described in subsection (a) of this section shall forward an original written report of the accident or a report of the accident in an

automated format to the department within ten days after the date of the accident.

- (f) *Forms.* The reports shall be made on a uniform traffic accident report form or in an automated format prescribed by the secretary. The uniform traffic accident report form shall be supplied by the secretary in sufficient quantities to meet the requirements of the department and the law enforcement agency.
- (g) *Copying reports.* Notwithstanding Wis. Stats. § 346.73, any person may with proper care, during office hours, and subject to such orders or regulations as the custodian thereof prescribes, examine or copy such uniform traffic accident reports, including supplemental or additional reports, statements of witnesses, photographs and diagrams, retained by local authorities, the state traffic patrol or any other investigating law enforcement agency.
- (h) *Data from reports.* The department, upon request of local enforcement agencies, shall make available to them compilations of data obtained from such reports.
- (i) *Copies of accident report.* Every law enforcement agency investigating or receiving a report of a traffic accident as described in subsection (a) of this section shall forward a copy of the report of the accident to the county traffic safety commission or to the person designated to maintain spot maps under Wis. Stats. § 83.013(1)(a) in the county where the accident occurred when the accident occurred on a county or town road or on a street where the population of the city, village or town is less than 5,000. For traffic accidents occurring within a city or village with a population of 5,000 or more, the law enforcement agency investigating or receiving a report shall forward a copy of the report of the accident to the city or village where the accident occurred.
- (j) *Falsifying reports.* No person shall falsely make and file or transmit any accident report or knowingly make a false statement in any accident report which is filed or transmitted pursuant to this section.

#### **Sec. 94-43. Abandoned vehicles.**

- (a) *Removal and impoundment.* Any vehicle in violation of this section shall be impounded pursuant to Wis. Stats. § 342.40 until lawfully claimed or disposed of under subsection (b); except if the chief of police determines that the cost of towing and storage charges for the impoundment would exceed the value of the vehicle, the vehicle may be junked by the city prior to expiration of the impoundment period upon determination by the chief that the vehicle is not wanted for evidence or other reason.
- (b) *Disposal.*
  - (1) a. If the chief of police determines that the value of an abandoned vehicle exceeds \$100.00, he shall notify the owner and lienholders of record by certified mail that the vehicle has been deemed abandoned and impounded by the city and may be reclaimed within 15 days upon payment of accrued towing, storage and notice charges, and if not so reclaimed shall be sold.
  - b. If an abandoned vehicle determined to exceed \$100.00 in value is not reclaimed within the period and under the conditions as in subsection

(b)(1)a., it shall be sold at private sale.

c. After deducting the expense of impoundment and sale, the balance of the proceeds, if any, shall be paid into the city treasury.

(2) Any abandoned vehicle determined by the chief of police to have a value of less than \$100.00 may be disposed of by direct sale to a licensed salvage dealer upon determination that the vehicle is not reported stolen.

(c) *Owner responsible for impoundment and sale costs.* The owner of any abandoned vehicle, except a stolen vehicle, is responsible for the abandonment and all costs of impounding and disposing of the vehicle. Costs not recovered for the sale of the vehicle may be recovered in a civil action by the city against the owner.

(d) *Notice of sale or disposition.* Within five days after the sale or disposal of a vehicle as provided in subsection (b)(1), (2), the chief of police shall advise the state department of transportation, division of motor vehicles, of such sale or disposition on a form supplied by the division. A copy of such form shall also be given to the purchaser of the vehicle. A copy shall also be retained on file in the city.

- (21) South side of Park Avenue from North Parkway Drive westerly 115 feet.

- (22) South side of Schley Street from Columbus Street to North Main Street.
- (23) West side of Lee Avenue between Maple Street and Ryan Street.
- (24) South side of Jackson Street 65 feet west of Main Street; north side of Jackson Street 54 feet west of Main Street and 50 feet east of Custer Street.
- (25) Both sides of Fairway Drive from 421 South Fairway Drive to 511 South Fairway Drive.
- (26) South side of Center Street between North Custer Street and North Main Street.

- (30) North side of Park Avenue from North Francis Street west 110 feet.
- (31) North side of Oak Street from North Francis Street west 60 feet.
- (32) West side of South Francis Street between Calumet Street and East Water Street.
- (33) North and south sides of Peters Drive from South Glenview Avenue east 500 feet.
- (34) East side of North Parkway Drive from the north exist of Horn Park to Park Avenue.
- (35) West side of North Parkway Drive from Park Avenue south 318 feet.

When signs are erected in any block giving notice, no person shall park any vehicle on any of the following streets or alleys or parts of such streets or alleys for longer than two hours between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. on Fridays and from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on any other day except Sundays and holidays:

- (1) Westernmost row of parking spaces of the City Hall, 130 Calumet Street, west public parking lot.
- (2) North side of Calumet Street with its intersection with Main Street east to the fire department driveway.
- (3) West side of Main Street commencing with a point on the north side of Park Avenue; across Main Street and south to a point 174.5 feet south of West Water Street directly in front of the light standard in front of the municipal pump station.
- (4) East side of Main Street from the south curb on Park Avenue south along the east side of Main Street to a point 174.5 feet south of West Water Street or directly across from the light standard in front of the pump station.
- (5) South side of Calumet Street from its intersection with Main Street east a distance of 106 feet.
- (6) North and South Main Streets between Park Avenue and West Water Street.
- (7) Directly in front of the city hall property on the north side of Calumet Street.
- (8) East side of North Francis Street from Park Avenue to a point 150 feet south.
- (9) North side of Oak Street between Main Street and Francis Street.
- (10) North side of Park Street between Main Street and Francis Street.
- (11) North side of Schley Street from its intersection with North Main Street west a distance of 150 feet.

- (1) East side of Francis Street from a point 45 feet north on Francis Street from the north side of Park Street to a point 165 feet north on Francis Street from the north side of Park Street (approximately 120 feet total length of zone).
- (2) North side of Park Avenue from North Parkway Drive 155 feet west.
- (3) West side of Custer Street from Center Street to a point 100 feet south.

## **Subdivision VIII. Heavy-Traffic Parking**

### **Sec. 94-346. Parking time limits.**

- (a) *Generally.* When signs are erected in any block giving notice, no person shall park any vehicle over 12,000 pounds on any of the following streets, alleys or parts of such streets or alleys for longer than the period herein specified between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. on Fridays and from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on any other day except Sundays and holidays:
  - (1) No person may park or leave standing on any city street, alley or parking lot a motor vehicle, trailer, implement of husbandry or other equipment for more than 24 hours other than a vehicle licensed as an automobile or truck with a gross vehicle weight of more than 12,000 pounds unless such street, alley or parking lot is designated a truck route.
- (b) *Truck routes.* No person may park or leave standing on any city street designated as a truck route a motor vehicle, trailer, implement of husbandry or other equipment for more than 72 hours other than a vehicle licensed as an automobile or truck with a gross vehicle weight of less than 12,000 pounds, or heavy traffic vehicle or trailer, as defined in section 94-366.
- (c) *Loading zone.* No person shall park a vehicle on the east side of Parkway Drive

between East Water Street and Madison Street in an area approximately 45 feet in length designated as a loading zone.

#### **Sec. 94-347. Penalties for violation of subdivision.**

### **DIVISION 7. HEAVY-TRAFFIC ROUTES**

#### **Sec. 94-366. Definitions.**

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this division, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

*Heavy traffic* means all vehicles not operating completely on pneumatic tires and all vehicles or combination of vehicles, other than motorbuses, designed or used for transporting property of any nature and having a gross weight of more than 6,000 pounds.

#### **Sec. 94-367. Operation on certain streets prohibited.**

No person shall operate a heavy-traffic vehicle on any streets or parts of streets not designated in section 94-368; however, the ordinary use of such streets for obtaining orders for supplies, or moving or delivering supplies or commodities to or from any place of business or residence fronting on such streets shall be permitted, but the weight of the vehicle and its load shall not exceed the limitations of Wis. Stats. § 348.15 or 348.16(3), pertaining to class "A" highways or deliveries on class "B" highways.

**ARTICLE IV. BICYCLES\***

**Sec. 94-386. Registration required.**

No person shall operate a bicycle or any similar wheeled vehicle customarily kept within the city upon any street or public way within the city unless the bicycle shall first have been registered by the owner and properly licensed or tagged as provided in this article.

**Sec. 94-387. License plates; fees.**

- (a) *Registration.* Registration of bicycles shall be made by filing an application with the police department, setting forth the name and address of the owner, together with a complete description of the bicycle on forms provided by the department, and paying a one time registration fee of \$3.00. Each registration shall be serially numbered and kept

on file in the police department as a public record. Upon such registration, the department shall affix an identification tag or license plate to the bicycle registered at or near the rear of the seat or saddle, such identification tag or license plate to be serially numbered to correspond with the registration number. Such tag or license plate shall remain fixed to the bicycle unless removed by order of the chief of police for cause.

- (b) *Inspection.* The chief of police shall inspect each bicycle presented for registration and may refuse registration of any bicycle found to be in unsafe mechanical condition.
- (c) *Fees placed in general fund.* All moneys received from fees provided for in this section shall be placed in the city's general fund.

#### **Sec. 94-388. Lost license plates.**

In case of theft, loss, mutilation or defacing of such tag or plate, a new tag or license plate shall be issued by the police department for \$1.00. No person shall willfully remove, deface or destroy any such identification tag or license plate.

#### **Sec. 94-389. Transfer and cancellation.**

- (a) *Transfer.* Within ten days after any bicycle registered under this article changes ownership, the registration of the person in whose name the bicycle had been registered shall be canceled and a new license plate shall be issued to the new owner upon payment by him of a \$1.00 registration fee.
- (b) *Cancellation.*
  - (1) In case of dismantling and taking out of operation or use of a bicycle, the registration shall be canceled and the identification tag or license plate returned to the police department.
  - (2) The chief of police may cancel the registration of and remove the identification tag from any bicycle being operated in the city in an unsafe manner or in violation of any law or ordinance. Such cancellation and removal shall be in addition to other penalties provided in this chapter.

#### **Sec. 94-390. Operation without owner's consent.**

No person shall operate a bicycle in the city without consent of the registered owner.

#### **Sec. 94-391. Rules of operation.**

Bicycles are classed as vehicles, and their operation shall be governed by all laws regulating traffic upon the streets of the city. In addition to complying with the bicycle

regulations imposed in Wis. Stats. §§ 346.77--346.81, the operator shall also comply with the following:

- (1) Persons operating bicycles shall signal for left-hand turns and stops with left hand extended.
- (2) No person operating a bicycle shall do trick riding such as riding the bicycle without keeping at least one hand upon the handlebars, nor engage in racing upon the city streets.
- (3) An operator of a bicycle may ride on any public residential sidewalk in a reasonably safe manner, but in no case shall such operator ride on the grass or lawns of any residential property or public park.

## ARTICLE V. SNOWMOBILES

### Sec. 94-416. State snowmobile laws adopted.

Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Chapter, the statutory provisions describing and defining regulations with respect to snowmobiles in the following enumerated sections of the Wis. Stats., are hereby adopted by reference and made part of this Chapter as if fully set forth herein. Acts required to be performed or prohibited by such statutes are required or prohibited by this Chapter. Any future amendments, revisions or modifications of the Statutes incorporated herein by reference are intended to be made part of this Code.

### **Sec. 94-417. Applicability of traffic regulations to snowmobiles.**

No person shall operate a snowmobile upon any street, highway or alley within the city in violation of the traffic regulation provisions of the Wis. Stats.

### **Sec. 94-418. Speed and equipment.**

- (a) *Speed.* No person shall operate a snowmobile within the city or on any trail or street or other public way designated in section 94-421 of this chapter at a speed in excess of twenty (20) miles per hour.
- (b) *Restriction on equipment.* No snowmobile or other vehicle operating within the city snowmobile route shall be allowed, if it is operating with an expansion chamber or any muffler other than a properly functioning muffler of the type and size provided by the manufacturer.
- (c) *Headlight.* Every snowmobile operating within the city must display a lighted headlight and taillight at all times, day or night and said lights must conform to the requirements of the Wis. Stats.

**Sec. 94-419. Unattended vehicles.**

No person shall leave or allow a snowmobile owned or operated by him/herself to remain unattended on any public highway or public property while the motor is running or with the starting key left in the ignition.

**Sec. 94-420. Operation on sidewalks prohibited.**

No person shall operate a snowmobile lengthwise upon any sidewalk, pedestrian way or upon the area between the sidewalk and the curb line of any street in the city, except as specifically authorized for the purpose of legally crossing the street, to obtain immediate access to an authorized area of operation.

**Sec. 94-421. Restrictions on operators.**

- a) No person under the age of 12 years may operate a snowmobile. No person over the age of 12 years but under the age of 16 years may operate a snowmobile unless he/she holds a valid snowmobile safety certificate or is accompanied by a person over 18 years of age or by a person over 14 years of age having a snowmobile safety certificate issued by the department of natural resources.
- b) No person shall operate any snowmobile upon any street, alley, or other public right-of-way in the city unless such person shall have a valid motor vehicle operator's license or unless such operator is accompanied by a person who has a valid motor vehicle operator's license and who is occupying a seat on the vehicle.

**Sec. 94-422. Snowmobile routes and trails designated.**

- (a) *Routes designated.* Except as provided in Wis. Stats., no person shall operate a snowmobile upon any public right-of-way, in any public park or cemetery or on any other public or private property in the city except upon snowmobile routes and trails designated by the city council. There shall be certain established routes or streets within the city limits. These snowmobile routes shall be designated as snowmobile routes and are to be used only to leave and enter the city at a speed not to exceed 20 miles per hour, under any circumstances or at any time of day or night.
- (b) Operation prohibited in certain areas:
  - (1) No person may operate a snowmobile for any reason on the following streets:
    - a. USH-10/East Ryan St. on its entire length
    - b. USH-10/West Ryan St. on its entire length

- c. CTH-PP/North Main St. on its entire length
  - d. CTH-PP/South Main St., South to Horn St.  
(operation along Fairway Dr. is allowed)
- (2) No person may operate a snowmobile in the following areas, unless authorization is obtained from the city council:
- a. Any city parks;
  - b. Any city cemeteries;
  - c. Any property owned or leased by the city;
- (3) Snowmobile routes are described as follows:
- a. Trail markers--The director of public works and city law enforcement officers are directed and authorized to procure, erect and maintain appropriate snowmobile route, trail and limit signs and markers as approved by the state department of natural resources under Wis. Stats.
  - b. Trail status--city law enforcement officers shall have the power to declare the stated snowmobile routes and trails either open or closed.
  - c. Markers to be obeyed--No person shall fail to obey any route or trail sign, marker or limit erected in accordance with this section or traffic sign or signal under authority of Wis. Stats.

**Sec. 94-423. Snowmobile travel within the city limits.**

- (a) *Statutory authority.* State law allows towns, cities and villages to enact local regulations allowing snowmobilers to travel between a legal trail to a place of lodging, stores or restaurants.
- (b) *Travel by shortest route.* Establishment to travel along roadways and / or shoulders of highways to the closest snowmobile route or trail. The authority to enact local snowmobile residential access regulations is found in the Wis. Stats. By authority of the Wis. Stats., the city does hereby provide for snowmobile access to residential areas, stores and lodging establishments within the city limits according to the guidelines set herein.
- (c) *Operation authorized.* This section allows the operation of a snowmobile on a roadway and / or shoulder of a street or highway by persons residing in or staying at a lodging establishment, shopping at local businesses or obtaining personal needs, within the limits of the City of Brillion, Calumet County, Wisconsin, for the sole purpose of traveling into or from the city by the shortest distance that is necessary to reach the snowmobile trail or route that is closest to that residence or business establishment.
- (d) *Conditions.* This section designates the roadways and / or shoulders of specific streets and highways for snowmobile travel by persons residing in the city, patronizing business or staying at a lodging establishment within the limits of the City of Brillion,

Calumet County Wisconsin, to travel for the shortest distance that is necessary to reach the snowmobile trail or route that is closest to that residence, business or lodging establishment subject to the following conditions:

- (1) Snowmobiles shall be operated on the extreme right side of the roadway and travel with the flow of traffic.
  - (2) Snowmobiles shall be operated in single file with headlights in operation at all times, day or night.
  - (3) Snowmobile operators shall yield the right-of-way to all other vehicular traffic and pedestrians.
  - (4) Snowmobiles violating any of the above conditions will be subject to the penalties outlined in Wis. Stats., and city ordinance.
  - (5) Speed--A snowmobile operated on any portion of the roadway or shoulder of a highway pursuant to this Section shall observe the 20 mile per hour speed limit.
- (e) *Enforcement.* This section shall be enforced by any law enforcement officer of the City of Brillion, Calumet County, Wisconsin, or such other local, county or state law enforcement officers.
- (f) *Penalties.* Wisconsin state snowmobile penalties as found in the Wis. Stats.

#### **Sec. 94-424. Penalty.**

Any person who shall violate any provision of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not more than \$500.00, together with the costs of prosecution and., in default of payment thereof, may be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed ten days, provided no person shall forfeit an amount in excess of the maximum fine or forfeiture allowed in the Wis. Stats., for the same offense and further provided that the penalty and forfeiture for parking violations on highways shall be the amount applicable to such violations by owners or operators of motor vehicles under Chapter 94 of this Code of Ordinances.

#### **Sec. 94-425. Enforcement.**

- (a) *Uniform traffic citation.* The uniform traffic citation promulgated under the Wisconsin State Statutes, shall be used for violations of this chapter relating to highway use except as herein provided.
- (b) *Parking violations.* The special standardized city parking ticket shall be used for enforcement of violations of rules of the road relating to parking of vehicles.
- (c) *Other violations.* All violations of this chapter not described in Subsections (a) or (b) shall be enforced in accordance with Wis. Stats. Stipulations of guilt or no contest may be made as provided in Wis. Stats. in substantially the form provided in the uniform traffic citation within five days of the date of the citation for such violation. Bail deposits. Payment may also be made under Wis. Stats. Such deposits shall include the city

municipal court costs listed in chapter 3 of this Code of ordinances.

- (d) *Forfeited penalties and deposits.* Except as otherwise provided in Wis. Stats. and the deposit schedule adopted by the state board of circuit court judges hereunder, required penalties and deposits or bail not including costs or fees for violation of this chapter shall be as established by the schedule adopted by the city common council.
