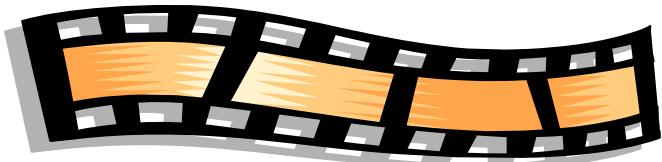

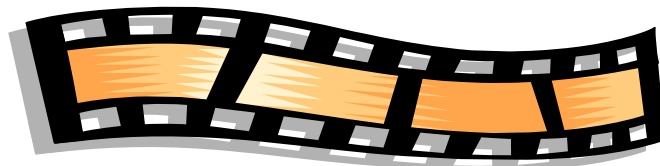


TUESDAY, FEB 17 12 NOON

Cuba and Haiti 60 minutes. Ian Wright begins his journey in Havana, Cuba exploring the beaches, bustling street markets and rumba filled back streets. He travels west to the tobacco province of Pinar del Rio, home of the cigar industry. The next leg of the journey takes him to Matanzas Province, the site of the Bay of Pigs invasion, and then on to Gran Piedra to view his next destination, Haiti. After a short visit to Port au Prince, Ian heads to Jacmel for the annual Carnival, known for papier mache masks and lively ra ra bands. Next he visits Haiti's holiest city, Souvenance, where he attends a voodoo ceremony. The journey ends at Citadelle Laferriere, the largest fort in the Western Hemisphere and a UNESCO World Heritage site located just outside of Cap Haitien.

TUESDAY, FEB 24 12 NOON

New Zealand 2 60 minutes. Ian Wright sets off from Auckland to visit the hot springs of Rotorua and then heads north to the Bay of Islands. He travels to Christchurch before heading to New Zealand's extreme sports capital, Queenstown. His journey ends with an overnight stay atop the Fox Glacier while Zay Harding's begins in the capital, Wellington. He travels to the town of Masterton to participate in a sheep shearing competition before taking the Tranzalpine train to Hokitika and the Wild Foods festival. His journey ends with a retreat into the wilderness of Lake Te Anau and a 2 day trek along the Milford Track.



TUESDAY, MAR 3 12 NOON

Cambodia 60 minutes. Ian Wright begins his journey to Cambodia by celebrating Buddah's Day at Phnom Da, the country's oldest temple. From there he travels to Kampot at the base of the Elephant Mountains and explores the Bokor Hill Station built by the French in 1912. He catches the slow train to Sihanoukville and sets off for the beaches of Koh Rong. From there he visits the capital of Phnom Penh, where he explores the central market and sits in on a rehearsal of a traditional dance. A flight to northern Mondulkiri Province brings him to a traditional hill tribe wedding. The final leg of the journey takes him to Lake Tonle Sap and on to Siem Reap. His visit to Cambodia ends exploring the ruins of the awe inspiring temple complex at Angkor.

TUESDAY, MAR 10 12 NOON

Cyprus & Crete 60 minutes. Globe Trekker K.T. Comer travels around the island of Cyprus. She starts at a beach party in the southern resort of Ayia Napa and moves to the ruins of Kourion to catch a midsummer's day festival. She then travels to a Greek Orthodox monastery at Kykkos before heading to Nicosia, the world's last divided capital city. She then meets the Bicommunal Choir for Peace and ends her journey in Kyrenia on the Northern Coast. Globe Trekker Adela Ucar visits the Greek island of Crete to learn more about the island's World War 2 history and experience the natural beauty along the walking trail, the E4.

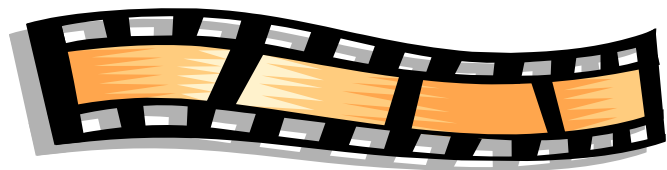


TUESDAY, MAR 17 12 NOON

Panama and Colombia 60 minutes. Megan McCormick visits Colombia and Panama, countries that are refreshingly untouched by mass tourism. Her first stop is in Panama City, where she takes in the sights and sounds, samples street food and shops for Panama hat. Then she ventures to the famous Panama Canal. Her next stop is the “Comarca” of Kuna Yala in the San Blas archipelago, a semi autonomous region belonging to the indigenous group, the Kuna. Her journey continues to Colombia and the capital Bogota, where she explores the country’s violent past and cocaine connection. She then travels to Cartagena taking in the colonial charm and enjoying Vallenato, one of their most popular rhythms. The last leg of the journey begins in Santa Marta where she treks into the jungle to find a Lost City on the slopes of the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta.

TUESDAY, MAR 24 12 NOON

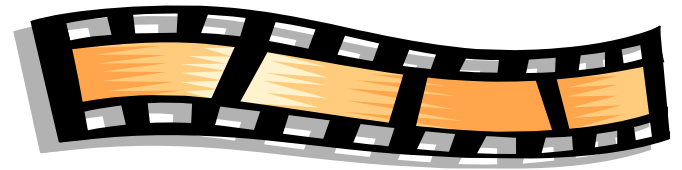

After a night in Seoul, he heads to the North-South Korean Border to experience military power at its most dramatic in the DMZ. His journey then takes him south to Jinbu, where he seeks solace and serenity with the Buddha. Next he visits the village of Hahoe and Pusan. At Pusan he visits the Jagalchi fish market. From Busan he travels to Cheju Island, famous for the Haenyo, women free divers who hunt for fresh fish and sea life everyday.



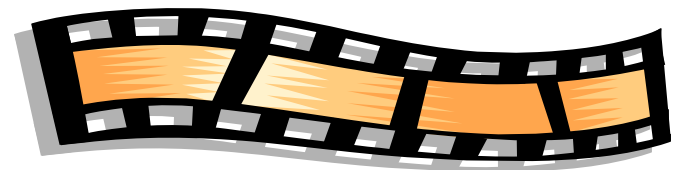

TUESDAY, MAR 31 12 NOON

Bolivia 60 minutes. Ian Wright explores Bolivia, finding one of the poorest countries in South America is also one of the richest in culture and landscape. His journey begins on Lake Titicaca, the world’s highest navigable lake where he visits the island of the sun. En route to the capital La Paz, he stops off in Copacabana and witnesses the blessing of the cars. His travels take him to Sucre and Tarabuco before reaching the mining centre of Potosi and the salt flats of Uyuni. After spending a night at Palacio De Sal, a hotel sculpted out of salt, he attends the Fiesta of San Miguel in Uncia. Returning to La Paz by bus he joins a group cycling to Coroico. His journey ends with a trek to Huayna Potosi, one of the spectacular Andean peaks that overlook the capital city.
