Weekly Garbage Collection

Every Wednesday, a private carrier under contract with the City of Brillion collects refuse. Residential collection charges are indicated as a line item on your annual property tax bill.

Recycling Collection and Guidelines

The Community Recycling Program is an environmental project designed to "help us help nature." Curbside collection is made by a contracted private carrier to recycle tin cans, aluminum, plastic jugs and other bottles, glass bottles, newspapers and cardboard.

Recycling Guidelines

Aluminum, Plastic, Glass, Tin, Steel:

May be co-mingled in transparent blue, white or clear bags. **No black yard bags.** All items are to be clean, rinsed out thoroughly, tops and caps removed.

- Aluminum - rinse out
- Tin containers - remove labels & rinse
- Steel containers - no scrap steel
- Plastics - #1 & # 2 (soap & soda bottles, milk jugs)
- Glass containers: clear, brown, green colors. Keep all bottles and jars whole.
- Glass items such as cocktail glasses, plate glass, and ceramics are not recyclable.

Used Computers and Computer Equipment

Wisconsin regulations prohibit businesses/institutions from disposing of computers in landfills. No similar regulations apply to residents, but those concerned about the integrity of Wisconsin's environment have a few options:

- Check with schools or nonprofit organizations to see if the computer is worthy of reuse. Donations are tax deductible.

- Utilize the Department of Natural Resources Recycling Markets Directory to locate a potential outlet. Search for electronics. No endorsements are implied of companies.

Batteries:

Will no longer be picked up by Veolia.

Cardboard and Paper:

Magazines, newspapers, and chipboard (cereal, cake boxes, etc) may be co-mingled in:

- Brown paper grocery bags
- Corrugated cardboard boxes
- Cereal, cake, and detergent boxes
- Soda or beer, i.e. 12, 18, 24, & 30 pack cartons

Guidelines for corrugated cardboard boxes:

- Must be flattened and bound.
- Large quantities should be cut into 2' X 2' sections, then flattened and bound.

Waste Oil:

Will no longer be picked up by Veolia.

Large Item Pickup

Items too large to fit into the polycart, such as furniture, will be collected on Wednesdays only if it has a sticker attached. Stickers may be purchased from City Hall during regular business hours. Stickers must be purchased by 12:00 noon on Friday in order to be picked up the following Wednesday. Stickers for appliances WITHOUT FREON such as stoves, washers, dryers, furniture, carpeting, TV's, etc. are \$5.00. Items containing Freon will not be accepted.

Freon Items:

Items containing Freon may be taken to Midshore Recycling in New Holstein. There is a \$25.00 charge per item.

Yard Waste Disposal

The Compost Site is conveniently available to all City Residents. It is located off USH 10 (W. Ryan Street) just east of Roehrborn's Meats. You may also purchase compost bins at Schroth's Garden and Nursery.

City Compost Site

Yard waste may be disposed of at the City compost site daily. Yard waste includes all materials originating in the yard and garden, which are capable of natural decomposition, including leaves, grass clippings, and other vegetation.

- Stumps, root balls, brush, limbs, etc. may be taken to the Compost Site.
- Please place items in the appropriate bin. Please do not leave boxes and bags at the compost site. These materials will not readily decompose.
- Homeowners are encouraged to return grass clippings to the soil in their lawn. It not only takes away the hassle of having to bag the clippings, but it also puts organic nitrogen (a valuable fertilizer) back into the soil.
- Please do not dispose of garbage, white goods, recyclables, construction materials or tires at the Compost Site.

Curbside Chipping

Spring through Fall, the City will chip brush, branches and limbs that have been placed on the curbside *the first Monday of the month, May - October* (weather permitting.)

- Branches and limbs must be no longer than 6 feet in length and no more than 6 inches in diameter. Brush must be piled with butt ends one way and must not overlap.
- Wood Chips: May be picked up at the City Compost Site.
- Residents are encouraged to take all branches, etc. to the Compost Site.
- Please do not mix the compost materials (grass clippings, leaves and miscellaneous vegetation such as flowers, garden plants, etc.) with the brush.
- **Brush piles not meeting above criteria will not be picked up.**

Curbside Leaf Pickup

Beginning early October, residents may rake leaves into the curb line of the street. Please do not place leaves in the curb line at any other time. Rather, compost leaves on site, or dispose of them, without charge, at the City Compost Site.

- When raking leaves into the street, please place them into shallow/small piles along the curb line, one foot away from the curb if possible. (Leaves in the terrace area will not be picked up.)
- Please do not mix branches, limbs or brush with the leaves, for they clog the street sweeper.
- If you wish to get rid of the leaves in a more timely manner, you may take them to the City Compost Site.

Redevelopment Authority Commission (5-year term)

Acts as the agent of the City to prevent and eliminate blighted areas within its district.



Noise

Please be considerate of your neighbors when operating any audible device, whether it be machinery or musical instruments. Operating such devices between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. in such a manner as to be plainly audible to your neighbors may be in violation.

Fire Pits

If you wish to have a recreational burning pit in your backyard, or renew your permit, apply at City Hall. The fee is \$15.00 and is good for 5 years. Contact City Hall for applications and conditions.

Curfew

The City enforces a curfew for residents less than 18 years of age. No child under the age of 18 years shall loiter, idle or remain upon any street or alley or other public place in the City between 10:00 p.m. on Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Thursdays and 6:00 a.m. the next day, and between 12:01 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on Saturdays and Sundays, unless such child is accompanied by his parent, guardian or other adult person having legal custody of such child or such child is in lawful employment making it necessary to be in such place after the time stated.

Winter Parking

The City of Brillion winter parking ban is in effect from November 15 through April 1. There is no parking on City streets without prior permission from the Police Department between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

Snow and Ice Removal

All property owners or occupants of a lot abutting a sidewalk are required to remove all snow and ice from sidewalks within 24 hours after a snowfall or sleet storm. Please do not plow or shovel snow into the streets.

Dogs and Cats

All City of Brillion residents owning a cat or dog that is older than 6 months is required to purchase a license. License fees:

- un-neutered/un-spayed cat or dog: \$8.00
- neutered/spayed cat or dog: \$3.00
- A \$5.00 late fee will be charged after the April 1st deadline
