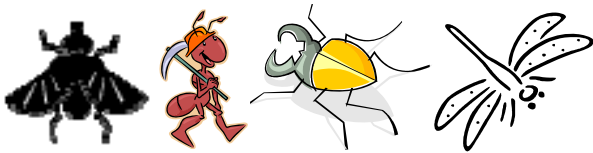

### Book Talking

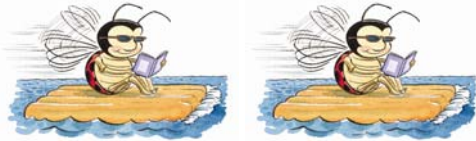
Book Talking will feature "Three cups of tea" by Greg Mortenson for its Sept 23rd

program. Program time is 1:30 p.m. Come join us! Copies of the book are available!



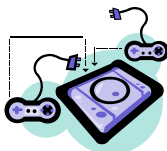
## Friends Meeting

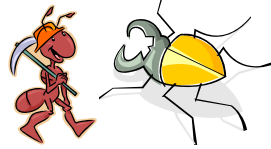


## Wii Tournaments
