Build a better world reading programs

The Brillion Library offers independent reading programs for the whole family. The school age reading program for youth going in to grades 1-6 features a reading log with youth needing to do 5 of the activities and 3 must be reading. The teen program for youth entering grade 7 and up features youth receiving credit for every 100 pages they read. Adults receive credit for every book or magazine they check out and read. Audiobooks also count for all reading programs.

Book Review

“The Fix’ by David Baldacci is the subject of this review

Amos Decker returns in this novel. He is the memory man who can remember just about everything. He witnesses a murder outside of FBI Headquarters. A man shoots a woman he meets and then turns the gun and shoots himself. The woman is dead and the shooter is in a coma. Decker starts to investigate and he can’t find any connection between the woman, who is a substitute school teacher and the man who is a family man who used to work for the government and now has his company.

Plenty of action in the story and we see the FBI and the DIA trying to investigate the murder and keep their territory. International espionage is part of the story as well.

There is a side story that takes place in the apartment complex that Amos is now living in. A man and his boy live in the building and the man is attacked by a group of men and Amos comes to his rescue. A fast paced story that keeps you turning the pages.
