2018 Hazardous Waste and Electronics Disposal

Advanced Disposal Landfill, Calumet County, and local governments have coordinated to offer local drop-off options for the safe disposal of hazardous wastes and recycling of used electronics. **Hazardous Waste Disposal:** Dates, times, and locations for hazardous waste drop-off programs being held throughout the county:

- Saturday, April 21, 9-11am, New Holstein Public Works Garage
- Friday, April 27, 9-11am, Harrison Public Works Garage
- Friday, May 18, 9-11am, Chilton Public Works Garage
- Saturday, June 2, 9-11am, New Holstein Public Works Garage
- Saturday, August 4, 9-11am, Harrison Public Works Garage
- Friday, September 7, 9-11am, Brillion Public Works Garage

Appointments are REQUIRED to participate, and openings are limited to 50 participating households per event. To make an appointment, or for more information, please see the Calumet County recycling website: www.calumetrecycles.com. Alternatively, participants without internet access can call 920-849-2361 Ext 750 or 920 989-2700 Ext. 750 in the Harrison/Appleton area and leave a message requesting an appointment or information; calls will be returned promptly. Hazardous wastes are products whose labels include the words caution, poison, combustible, danger, warning, flammable, or corrosive. Hazardous wastes that can be brought to the disposal program includes, but are not limited to, solvents, fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides, rodent baits, lead and oil based paints, kitchen and bathroom cleaners, bug sprays, old gasoline, transmission fluid and antifreeze. Latex paint IS NOT ACCEPTED.

Electronics: Waste electronics such as televisions, computers, VCR's and household appliances will be collected at separate events. No appointments are required for these events, and participants should be prepared to wait in line. Two events are scheduled:

- Wednesday, May 16, 1-6pm, Chilton Public Works Garage
- Wednesday, June 13, 1-6pm, Harrison Public Works Garage

Free Large Item

Garbage Pickup:

Monday, April 23 – East side of Main St
Monday, April 30 – West side of Main St.

Residents should place items on the curb prior to the morning of pickup. Advanced Disposal will not clean up messes left by improperly prepared material or left by scavengers. All electronic items and items containing Freon will not be picked up. Please note that this Free Large Item pickup is only offered once a year. There will not be a fall pickup date in 2018.



2018 City Street Project

In late spring/early summer of 2018 the following street projects will take place.

Custer Street Utility and Street Improvement Project

Custer Street (W. Water Street to Jackson Street). The project will include water and sanitary sewer main replacement, sidewalk and driveway apron replacements as needed, curb & gutter replacement as needed, replacement or remediation of private sanitary sewer laterals from the main to the home, replacement of water laterals to the curb stop, replacement of the lead water lateral to home, construction of storm sewer laterals to the property line, and street reconstruction.

Bentwood Drive Street Improvement and Mini-Storm Sewer Project

Bentwood Drive (Valley View Drive to Driftwood Drive). The project will include construction of mini-storm sewers in right-of-way where needed, construction of storm sewer laterals to the property line, replacement of all mountable curb and gutter, replacement of concrete driveway aprons and sidewalk as needed, and rehabilitation/repaving of street.

These projects will be complete by the end of August.

Construction is never easy; there will be dirt, mud, dust and construction equipment. Please keep children away from the construction site to avoid injury. We ask for your patience and understanding as we make the necessary infrastructure improvements in the City. Thank you in advance for all your cooperation.

Garbage and recycling cans should not be placed on the street. They should be placed by the curb Tuesday nights.



COMPOST SITE: The compost site has been dressed up for this year. We have new signs clearly marking the areas for deposit. We are adding a new bin which will be for Dirt, Landscape stone and Gravel on the south side of the Compost. **PLEASE** do your part to keep this area clean and organized. Place your waste in the proper designated area. Remember, this area is not for garbage. No plastic bags or decorations are to be dumped here. Help save our planet, **RECYCLE!**

NOTE: ATVs/UTVs are not allowed at the Compost Site. This is a reminder that ATVs/UTVs are not allowed to travel along US HWY 10.

2018 Garbage & Recycling Fees

The annual Garbage and Recycling User Fees for the City of Brillion residents will be applied to your 2017 Property Tax bills which are payable in 2018. This amount will be added to the first installment of the property tax bill and will be due by January 31, 2018. The 2018 user fees are:

45 gallon = \$125
65 gallon = \$130
95 gallon = \$138

Registration Deadline is May 25.

Department of Public Works Curbside Pickup for brush, tree branches, shrubs starts First Monday of the month starting May 7 through October 1.

- The public works department will chip brush, tree branches, shrubs, woody vines (excluding boards, posts, lumber, beams or their fragments) less than 6 in. in diameter at resident curbside(s).
- Brush must be neatly piled or it will not be picked up. No material with dirt on it will be picked up.
- Tree limbs and branches in lengths no longer than 6 ft. and not to exceed 6 in. in diameter may be placed at the curbside.
- Woody vines, branches or shrubs to be chipped must be piled in stacks or bundles, not to exceed 2 ft. wide by 4 ft. long.
- Wood chips are available to city residents at the city compost site.
